

# Tauranga Pool and spa Quick set up guide

## Step 1: Fill and Purge

Always fill your spa by removing a filter and putting the hose in the intake hole.

Once at fill level sticker turn on the spa, wait 10 seconds and press the jet button to purge the pump of air. Turn off after 20 seconds. (press temp up button to return touch pad screen to 'home screen')

## Step 2: Heat

Heat your spa pool to the desired temperature using touch-pad.

## Step 3: Water Treatment

Ensure the cover is off and the pump running. Dip test the water Test for pH, alkalinity, Total Hardness Santiser level (Bromine or Chlorine)

Dose spa as per test based on approx.

1,300 litres – Tauranga,

1,200 litres - Phutukawa, Mauao

1,000 litres – Manuka, Pounamu,

800 litres – Paua

350 litres – Piha

## Step 4: Test Water the following day

Use test strips. Dose again if necessary

Note – PH decrease drops both PH and Aklalinity

PH buffer – (although called PH buffer this raises the alkalinity)

Note: Unbalanced spa water can damage your spa pumps and heaters.

Note: Low water hardness can damage your spa pumps and heater. High water hardness will create a build-up of scale.

## Set clock and check settings and Bluetooth

Use the spa manual to set the clock.

Ensure spa is in high range mode indicated by ▲ (Low range ▼ )on home screen

Ensure spa displays 'Ready' mode on home screen

Bluetooth – JOYONWAY - 2288

Regularly dip test your spa (insta strip available in store)

Clean filters once a week with filter cleaner (available in store)

Shock your spa once a week (chlorine or oxygen based shock available in store)

Replace filters when necessary (annually minimum) (filters available in store)
